HEIRLOOM CORN VARIETIES



The open-pollinated corn varieties used by our ancestors to make whiskey are disappearing. When they are gone, they will be gone forever.

There is no established date for when a corn variety becomes heirloom. Some varieties, such as blue corn, have been grown and used by Native Americans for a millennia, while others were developed as late as the early 20th century.

Heirloom varieties all have three things in common. They are:

- Open-pollinated (not hybrids)
- Not grown on a commercial scale
- Genetically different from today's hybrid and GMO corns

Most original and regionally specific corn varieties are no longer being planted. We intend to start with *Tennessee Red Cob*, *Hickory Cane White Dent* and *Pencil Cob White* varieties, all of which were commonly grown in the Missouri and Arkansas Ozarks prior to the introduction of hybrids in the 1930's.
